

#### **During the Competition**

- \* Come to the elimination round with your participation pass issued by the office, sign in for registration at the designated time, then follow the instructions by the staff members.
- \* The performance order will not be the same as the application order.
- \* The music editions can be chosen freely except for those for which the edition is specified.
- \* Your performance may be cut off due to some procedural reasons, but it does not affect the result.
- \* It is not required to play from memory.
- \* It is only the contestants and their accompanists who are allowed in the green rooms as a matter of principle.
- \* Contestants who do not turn up on time may be regarded as withdrawn.
- \* Regarding the accompanist, see the description of each division.
