\* The first rounds of the solo and piccolo divisions shall be held online with the recorded performance.

\* One person can double-apply for Solo and Alto Flute divisions, or Piccolo and Alto Flute divisions (no other combination of applications will not be accepted).

#### «Eligibility for Participation»

- \* Open to any nationality and age.
- \* Member of the Japan Flutists Association (including those who join JFA on this occasion)
- \* Those who participate in this convention for whole period. (Those who do not apply for the participation for whole convention period will not be accepted).
- % Past first prize winners of this competition are not eligible for the same division.

#### «Notes for contestants in all the divisions»

- \* Apply online through the website of Japan Flutists Association.
- \* You need to "apply for the whole period" of the convention.
- \* If you wish to apply for more than one division, you are required to submit one application each for each of the divisions.
- \* If you have unavoidably to withdraw from the competition, please let us know as soon as possible at Convention Office c/o JFA, (+81-(0)3-3442-7420 or jfc entry@japan-flutists.org).
- \* Change of the repertoire cannot be allowed after the application is made.

#### «Operation of the Competition»

- \* Contestants should check in at the venue for the elimination round at the designated time with their participation pass issued by the office, then follow the instructions by the staff members.
- \* The performance order will not be the same as the application order.
- \* The music editions can be chosen freely except for those which the edition is specified for.
- \* Your performance may be cut off due to some operational reasons, but it does not affect the result.
- \* It is not required to play from memory.
- \* It is only the contestants and their accompanists who are allowed in the green rooms as a matter of principle.
- \* Contestants who do not turn up on time may be regarded as withdrawn.

#### «Accompanists»

\* Official accompanists will be provided by the organizer. Contestants who play with an official accompanist have to follow the rehearsal schedule instructed by the organizer. A request for a particular pianist cannot be accepted. Requesting to play with an official pianist does not change the participation fee. Contestants are also allowed to bring their own accompanist and the same condition will be provided regarding the length of time and the venue for the rehearsal as the case with an official pianist. Those who do so, however, must bear all the expenses for the accompanist. Participation fee is not required for the accompanist but the accompanist is not permitted to participate in the other events.

#### [Repertoire]

< Preliminary Round >

Play (1) and (2).

(1) <Duet> Fr. Kuhlau : 2nd movement, Adagio con anima, from Grand Duo Op. 39-No. 3

<Trio> Fr. Kuhlau : 3rd movement, Adagio, from Grand Trio Op. 90

<Quartet> Fr. Kuhlau : 3rd movement, Adagio molto con espressione, from Grand Quartett Op. 103

(2) A piece of free choice (which should not exceed 6 minutes); An arranged piece is acceptable.

< Final >

Two pieces of free choice. (The duration including the time between the pieces should not exceed 20 minutes.) One should be an original work though the other can be an arranged piece.

- The contestants can make some cuts in the pieces of free choice in order to make the duration fit in the allowed length of time.
- The piece of free choice for the preliminary round can be an extract of the pieces for the final.
- For (2) in the preliminary round and the final, the instruments allowed to use include piccolo, soprano flute, flute, flute d'amour, alto flute, bass flute, F-bass flute or contrabass flute.
